As you are aware, COVID-19 pandemic has confronted the world with an unprecedented situation and one of the foremost concerns from the different aspects of COVID-19 is its impact on mental health of different sections of the population.

During such a crisis, the emotional and psychological needs of certain groups, especially children, who are isolated due to being diagnosed as COVID positive, and are therefore forced to be in isolation/quarantine in hospitals have been facing exponentially higher level of stress, anxiety, fear, worry, depression, and loss of appetite. Similarly vulnerable are those children who have lost their parents/family, and/or whose parents/siblings, family members are in quarantine centres or hospitals. Children with various physical and mental disabilities and especially mental health disorders are also more vulnerable during this trying time.

It is also seen that COVID-19 associated mental health risk disproportionately hit children who are already disadvantaged and marginalized and may result in tremendous burden of mental health disorders in this age group. It is more critical than ever to ensure that the challenges faced by children are adequately addressed.

In this regard, the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) with India Co-Win Action Network (I-CAN) has created a network of qualified and trained Counsellors/Psychologists/Experts for providing psychological first-aid and emotional support through its toll free tele-counselling SAMVEDNA (Sensitizing Action on Mental Health Vulnerability through Emotional Development and Necessary Acceptance) (1800-121-2830)(from Mon-Sat 10.00AM-1.00PM and 3 PM to 8 PM). Technical support in terms of training of counsellors has been provided by NIMHANS. This toll-free number is available for children who are affected during COVID 19 pandemic, who may need counselling, including children who are isolated in facilities or are in quarantine centres or hospital.

In light of the above, you are requested to circulate the information of toll-free tele-counselling in all the COVID Care/Isolation Centres of respected States/UTs and sensitize isolation centres staff regarding referring the child in need of counselling on this toll-free number (Poster on SAMVEDNA is enclosed in e-mail). You may also please wish to share this information with the children of doctors/frontline health workers who have lost their lives during the COVID-19 pandemic to provide psycho-social support.
